The relations of the War Department to the National Guard of the several States, Territories, and District of Columbia are governed by the provisions of the Constitution of the United States which pertain to the militia and by the Federal laws which have been enacted by Congress pursuant to the authority conferred by the constitutional provisions. These constitutional provisions and Federal laws may be enumerated as follows: A. Constitutional Provisions. 2. A well-regulated militia being necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed. (Art. II, amendments.) 3. The Congress shall have power (a) To provide for calling forth the militia to execute the laws of the Union, suppress insurrections, and repel invasions. (b) To provide for organizing, arming, and disciplining the militia and for governing such part of them as may be employed in the service of the United States, reserving to the States, respectively, the appointment...
